Into His Presence Similar Situations

- Joshua 7 Achan entering the Promised Land
- 2 Samuel 6 Uzzah bringing the ark into Jerusalem
- Acts 5 Ananias and Sapphira and their property

Into His Presence False Hopes

This passage warns against:

- Going beyond boundaries set by God in worship or service.
- Empty enthusiasm that imitates the work of the Spirit.
- See John 4:23-24

Wishful thinking?

- Formalism based on rituals
- Legalism based on rules
- A good upbringing or good behavior
- Mere sorrow over sin
- Mere religious fervor of any kind

Into His Presence Possible Objections

Aren't other people just as good as Christians? How can God condemn them?

- Yes, they are just as good or just as bad.
- A true Christian believes he/she has no merit before God but the merit of Christ.
- This is precisely what others lack but are welcome to receive.

Why such a high price? Why such a harsh penalty? Why death?

- God had given clear instructions.
- Not a ceremonial flaw, but in essence rebellion.
- It's not unusual for rebellion against a ruler to be punishable by death.
- To reduce the penalty is to attempt to find merit in the fallen human condition.
- Merit seeks a right standing before God.
- Merit says, "We are good enough."
- The law cannot reward goodness.
- It can only condemn wrong.

Why just one way? Isn't that closed minded?

- The Bible's answer:
- Our situation was so hopeless that only God could provide the remedy.
- His remedy is Jesus Christ.

Possible Analogies:

- Why only one sun to shine over the whole earth?
- Why do our lungs only process oxygen when we breathe?
- Why only oxygen from air and not water?
- Why are some things more expensive than we wish?
- Only Jesus saves.
