



- The term Ecclesiastes means "preacher" or "teacher" one who addresses a gathering of people.
- Perhaps, late in life King Solomon brought his people together and read these words aloud to the assembly.

- Ecclesiastes is the cry of a believer who has lost his way.
- Solomon is desperately searching for meaning in a life without God.
- Nowhere in this book does the Teacher use the personal name of God "Yahweh" revealed to the Jewish people.

#### 1 Kings 11:4-6 (ESV)

<sup>4</sup> For when Solomon was old his wives turned away his heart after other gods, and his heart was not wholly true to the LORD his God, as was the heart of David his father. <sup>5</sup> For Solomon went after Ashtoreth the goddess of the Sidonians, and after Milcom the abomination of the Ammonites. <sup>6</sup> So Solomon did what was evil in the sight of the LORD and did not wholly follow the LORD, as David his father had done.

- Ecclesiastes is in the Bible to show the pointlessness of all worldly pursuits.
- It shows that our happiness does not lie in any natural wisdom or knowledge, nor wealth, nor honor, nor power, nor pleasure, nor even in the external trappings of religion.


The key word in the book is:

Vanity – used 37 times

Pointlessness, meaninglessness, uselessness, waste, nonsense

The key phrases in the book are:

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"under the sun" – 29 times

"on", "upon", or "to the earth" – 8 times

"under heaven" – 3 times
